The weather is warming up in Wine Country and high season is kicking into gear. Here are four events worth planning a trip around:

April 5: Charles Krug officially debuts its new, years-in-the-making Historic Redwood Cellar & Hospitality Center in St. Helena. There are still a few reservation slots should you want to book a family reserve tasting (\$40) or limited release tasting (\$50).

The site will also be home to concert and comedy performances, including scheduled appearances by Graham Nash (April 29-30) and Lewis Black (July 10-12).

**April 12:** Chef Stephen Barber of Farmstead at Long Meadow Ranch (738 Main Street) in St. Helena presents Ribology, a demonstration of regional styles and techniques and barbecue science, plus a tour of the estate's vegetable garden, followed by a family-style meal. April 25-27: Stags Leap District Winegrowers Association celebrates its 25th anniversary with Vineyard to Vintner, a two-day festival featuring wine dinners, open houses and seminars, culminating in a final brunch and Silverado Appellation Collection tasting at Meadowood Napa Resort. You can choose from one-day to three-day package weekend options depending on how deep you want to go.
